In this session, we aim to discuss both the progresses made in improving research career development in Europe and how to pursue them (namely the European Charter for Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers) and the remaining challenges for tackling precarity and fragmentation (absence of research careers in the European Qualifications Framework, lack of standard tenure track regime and career assessment, etc.).

Session 2: Challenges and opportunities for a fair promotion of brain circulation

Mobility of researchers is crucial for knowledge and innovation exchange and is recognised as a keystone for the full development of the European Research Area. However, an uneven distribution of talent may aggravate the unbalance between countries and regions with high and low R&I intensity. This session is aimed at considering possible measures to promote a sustainable model for removing the geographical barriers to researchers' mobility while tackling the problem of significant out-migration (brain drain). Reflections on the current pandemic crisis' influence on physical mobility of researchers, with direct impact on knowledge circulation and the consolidation of the ERA, are also welcomed.

Session 3: Cross sectoral mobility and career paths

In most EU countries there is a mismatch between the industry and businesses' demands and the skills and training of researchers, as well as a mutual misunderstanding and distance between the private sector and the academia. This has a negative impact on innovation and productivity and on the employability of researchers, who mostly are forced to rely on few tenure-track positions in the public scientific systems. This session will be focused on debating enhanced intersectoral circulation schemes and the involvement of the private sector in training and skills development at high level, as means to boost opportunities for researchers outside academia and diversify career paths.
